Rules and Regulations

for all sections

- 1 All exhibits to be the property of the exhibitor. Exhibits in the Horticultural and Agricultural Sections must have been grown on land in his/her occupation, except in classes F1-F7.
- 2 The committee reserves the right to have a garden inspected to see that Rule 1 is observed and reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 3 Every exhibit must bear a card with the class number and exhibitor's number. These cards will be obtained from the secretary on the morning of the show.
- 4 Fruit and vegetables shall be shown on plates, dishes or trays, provided by the exhibitor. No responsibility will be undertaken by the committee for any damage done to the exhibit or for loss or damage to any article. Exhibitors to provide own vases.
- 5 A prize will be withheld or modified if, in the judges opinion, the entry is undeserving of the prize offered.
- 6 The decision of the judges is final as to the relative merit of the exhibits, and the decision of the Committee shall be final on matters concerned with the Show.

- 7 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes count 3, 2, and 1. If more than one prize is awarded to an exhibitor in any one class, only the highest value counts.
- 8 Any protest must be delivered in writing to the Secretary no later than 4pm on the day of the show and must be accompanied by a deposit of £5 which will be refunded if the protest is upheld but not otherwise.
- **9** All exhibits must be staged no later than 10.00am on the day of the show and no exhibits to be removed before 5.00pm.
- **10** All exhibits must be removed from the show tent by 6.00pm.
- 11 Entries accompanied by entry fees must be made no later than Wednesday 13th August 2025.
- 12 Prize money will be paid out by the Treasurer from 4.30pm. on production of white entry cards. Neither exhibits nor coloured cards to be removed from the show until after 5:00pm.

Prizes NOT collected on the day may be collected from Bunners.

Prize money not collected by 13th September 2025, will be forfeited.





Industrial Section Recipes

Class In3

Montgomery Beer Bara Brith

100g currants, 100g sultanas, 1 egg, 100g brown sugar, 1 tablespoon marmalade, ½ teaspoon mixed spice, 200g self raising flour, pinch of salt, 250 to 300ml Monty's Dark secret or Best Offa beer (enough to cover the fruit).

Method: Soak the fruit in the beer overnight making sure the fruit is completely covered. Line a 2lb loaf tin and heat the oven to 160°C. Add to the fruit the egg, sugar and marmalade and mix well. Add the rest of the ingredients and turn into the loaf tin. Cook for 1 to 1 ½ hours or until cooked.



Class In5 Chocolate Chip and Vanilla Marble Cake

225g soft margarine, 225g caster sugar, 275g self raising flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 4 eggs, 2 tablespoons milk, ½ teaspoon vanilla essence, 1½ tablespoons cocoa powder, 2 tablespoons of hot water, 50g plain chocolate chips.

Icing: 50g each of plain and white chocolate broken into pieces.

Method: Preheat the oven to 180°C. Grease and line a 30 x 23cm roasting tin. Place the margarine, sugar, flour, baking powder, eggs, milk and vanilla essence into a bowl and beat well until completely blended. Spoon half the mixture into the tin dotting them spaced apart. In a small bowl, blend the cocoa powder and the hot water. Cool and then add to the remaining mixture with the chocolate chips. Spoon the chocolate mixture into the tin to fill the gaps. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes or until cooked. Melt the white and plain chocolate separately. When the cake has cooled, drizzle both of the icings over the cake to decorate. Leave to set before cutting into squares.


Class In6

Melting Moment Biscuits

Biscuits: 200g butter, 190g icing sugar, 155g plain flour, 140g cornflour, ½ teaspoon baking powder.

Filling: 2 tablespoons of custard powder, 100g butter, 150g icing sugar, 2 to 3 tablespoons of water.

Method: For the biscuits, sift all the dry ingredients into a bowl, add the butter and blend with a hand mixer. Using your hands, roll the mixture into 24 balls. Line 2 baking trays and place the balls on the trays, about 5cms apart. Flatten down the top of each ball until they are about double the size. Bake in a preheated oven at 180°C for about 9 minutes until they are light brown in colour. Be careful not to overcook them or they will be too crispy. For the custard filling, mix the custard powder, butter and icing sugar in a bowl and gradually add the water until you have the right spreading consistency. When the biscuits are cool spread the filling on one biscuit and sandwich together with another biscuit. Dust with icing sugar to serve.



Class In7

Vegan Lemon Drizzle Cake

200g self raising flour, 75g ground almonds, 200g golden caster sugar, 1 teaspoon baking powder, a pinch of salt, 2-3 lemons, 125ml light olive oil, 175ml unsweetened plant-based milk.

Drizzle: 1 lemon, 100g demerara sugar.

Method: Preheat the oven to 180°C and line a 1.3kg loaf tin with baking parchment. For the cake batter, put the flour, almonds, sugar, baking powder and salt into a bowl and mix well with a fork. Zest the lemons and place in a bowl. Juice them until you have 50ml of juice (you may need a 3rd lemon to do this) then add the olive oil and the milk to the bowl with the zest and juice. Mix the wet ingredients into the dry and stir everything together. Spoon into the prepared tin, and bake for 30 to 35 minutes or until cooked. While the cake is cooking, zest the lemon into a bowl and add the juice. Tip in the demerara sugar, and stir until the sugar dissolves. Turn out the cake and make holes in the top with a skewer and pour the lemon juice mixture all over the top. Allow to cool before cutting.

Class In9

Sweet Potato and Orange Cupcakes

50g clear honey, 100g light brown sugar, 100g soft butter, 1 teaspoon of orange extract, 2 eggs, 150g of coarsely grated sweet potato, 200g self raising flour, 1 teaspoon mixed spice, 125g chopped dried apricots.

Icing: 75g soft butter, 150g icing sugar, grated zest of 2 oranges, 25g clear honey.

Method: Preheat the oven to 180°C and place 9 cupcake cases in a muffin tin. Beat the honey, sugar, butter and orange extract until smooth. Beat in the eggs and then stir in the sweet potato, flour, spice and chopped apricots. Spoon the mixture into the cases and bake for 25 minutes. Leave to cool in the tin. For the icing, beat together the butter, icing sugar, orange zest and honey to a smooth consistency then thin with a little water. Spread over each of the cakes.

Class In11 Treacle Tart

Pastry: 170g plain flour, pinch of salt, 125g cold diced butter, 3-4 tablespoons of cold water

Filling: 175ml golden syrup, 85g fresh white breadcrumbs, grated rind of 1 lemon, 2 tablespoons of lemon juice.

Method: Make up the pastry and then place in the fridge for around 20 minutes. Roll out the pastry and line a 20cm quiche tin and once again refrigerate for 20 minutes. Preheat the oven to 180°C. In a saucepan melt the syrup. Remove from the heat and add the breadcrumbs and lemon rind. Allow to sit for 10 minutes so breadcrumbs absorb the syrup then add the lemon juice. Spread the mixture over pastry and bake for approximately 30 minutes or until cooked.

Class In14 Chocolate Amaretti Cake

150g of 70% dark chocolate, 50g Amaretti biscuits, 100g flaked almonds, 175g caster sugar, finely grated zest of 1 orange, 100g of butter cut into cubes, 4 eggs, cocoa powder or icing sugar for dusting.

Method: Preheat the oven to 180°C and line the base of a 20cm springform tin with baking parchment. Melt the chocolate in a bowl over water in a saucepan. Place the amaretti biscuits, flaked almonds, sugar and orange zest in a food processor and whiz until ingredients are like fine breadcrumbs. Add the butter and eggs and mix. Then add the chocolate and whiz again until blended. Pour the mixture into the tin and cook for 35 minutes or until cake is puffed up and slightly cracked at the sides. Remove from the oven and allow to sit for 15 minutes before removing it from the tin. The cake will crack so you can always dust with icing sugar or cocoa.

Class In16

Spiced Red Onion Chutney

2 tablespoons of olive oil, 1 kg of red onions thinly sliced, ½ teaspoon of salt, 2 bay leaves, 200g dark soft brown sugar, 100ml balsamic vinegar, 150ml red wine vinegar, 1 teaspoon ground allspice, 2 cinnamon sticks, 1 star anise, 5 cloves.

Method: Heat the oil in a saucepan and add the onions, salt and bay leaves and cook for 20 minutes until softened. Stir in the vinegars, sugar and allspice. Wrap the whole spices in muslin and add to the pan. Stir well and reduce the heat to low and allow to bubble for 35 to 45 minutes stirring occasionally until dark sticky and reduced. Remove the bay leaves and spice bag and spoon into hot sterilised jars.

Class In17

Sugar Free Freezer Jam

450g fresh strawberries, finely grated zest and juice of 1 lemon and orange, 45g honey, 1 teaspoon vanilla paste, 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon.

Method: Hull the strawberries and place in a large bowl. Using a potato masher or a stick blender, mash them up maintaining some of the pieces for texture in the finished jam. Place the lemon and orange zest and juice and honey in a saucepan with 200g of the strawberries. Place over a medium heat and bring quickly to the boil stirring all the time. Let the mixture bubble for 3 minutes (watch the mixture doesn't burn) It will thicken considerably. Remove from the heat and add the remaining strawberries, vanilla and cinnamon. Place into clean warm jars and seal. Do not fill to the top as the jam will expand in the freezer. The jam will keep for up to 1 year in the freezer.
